Lenten Program

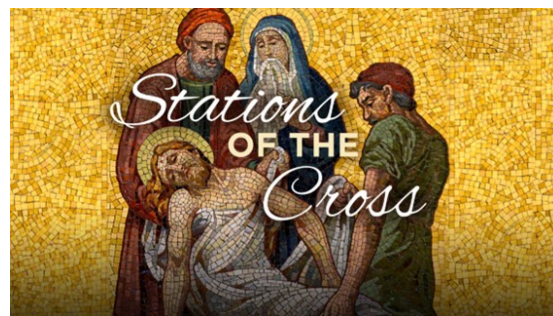


Our Lenten Program will commence on **Monday 19th February**.

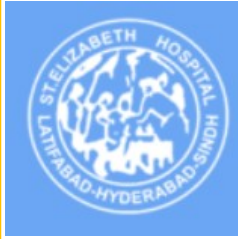
Altar Society

About St Elizabeth Hospital

Not only is St Elizabeth a hospital, but a facility for training nurses and midwives to guarantee the future of Pakistani women and babies. St Elizabeth's Hospital was established in 1958 and is a non-profit institution. It is owned by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Hyderabad and is run on its behalf by the Medical Board of the Diocese. Since 1975, St Elizabeth has been staffed by Pakistani personnel.

In 2010, St. Elizabeth Hospital is the sole medical provider for 12,000 people in nearby villages. Free medication is provided. The major health issues that need attention are: a. Provision of ante-natal, natal and post-natal care b. Infantile anaemia c. General medical care for all sexes and age, including diagnosis, treatment, and provision of medicines d. TB diagnosis with referral to the TB care center to the Government TB Sanatorium in Hyderabad e. Hepatitis A, B and C diagnosis and treatment. f. nothing for my own but nights of grief.
Lying in bed I wonder, 'When will it be

have passed, and vanished, leaving no
hope behind. Remember that my life is but
a breath, and that my eyes will never again

I might have been paid for it, but as I have
not, it is a responsibility which has been
put into my hands. Do you know what my
reward is? It is this: in my preaching, to be
able to offer the Good News free, and not

insist on the rights which the gospel gives
me.

So though I am not a slave of any man I
have made myself the slave of everyone so
as to win as many as I could. For the weak
I made myself weak. I made myself all
things to all men in order to save some at
any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of
the gospel, to have a share in its blessings.

Gospel**Mark 1:29-39****A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark**

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with
James and John straight to the house of
Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-
in-law had gone to bed with fever, and
they told him about her straightaway. He
went to her, took her by the hand and
helped her up. And the fever left her and
she began to wait on them.
That evening, after sunset, they brought to
him all who were sick and those who were
possessed by devils. The whole town came
crowding round the door, and he cured
many who were suffering from diseases of
one kind or another; he also cast out many
devils, but he would not allow them to
speak, because they knew who he was.
In the morning, long before dawn, he got
up and left the house, and went off to a
lonely place and prayed there. Simon and
his companions set out in search of him,
and when they found him they said,
'Everybody is looking for you.' He an-
swered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neigh-
bouring country towns, so that I can
preach there too, because that is why I
came.' And he went all through Galilee,
preaching in their synagogues and casting
out devils.
