
CWF Parish Appeal

The Ascension of the Lord

The Ascension of the Lord is the crowning of his resurrection. It is his official entry into the glory which was due him after the humiliation of Calvary; the return to the Father which he had foretold on Easter day: "I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God" (Jn 20:17) were his words to Magdalen. And to the disciples of Emmaus he had said: "Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and so enter into his glory?" (Lk 24:26). This shows he was not indicating a future return and glorification, but one that was immediate and already present because it was closely connected with the resurrection. Still, in order to strengthen the disciples in the faith, it was necessary for all to take place in a visible manner, as it did for the forty days after Easter. Those who had seen our Lord die on the cross, amid insults and jeers, must be witnesses to his final exaltation into heaven. The evangelists treat the facts with considerable moderation, yet their account makes Christ's power and glory stand out: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Mt 28:18), and Mark adds: "The Lord Jesus . . . was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God" (16:19). On the other hand, Luke records the last great blessing Christ gave his apostles: "While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up to heaven" (24:51). Jesus' divine majesty shines through his last talks. He speaks as one who can do everything when he predicts to his disciples that in his name "they will cast out demons, they will speak in new tongues, they will pick up serpents, and if they drink any deadly thing it will not hurt them. They will lay their hands on the sick and they will recover" (Mk 16:17-18). The acts of the Apostles bear their witness to the truth of all this. Then Luke, both in the conclusion of his Gospel and in the Acts, speaks of the great promise of the Holy Spirit who is to confirm the Apostles in their mission and in the powers they have received from Christ: "Behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you" (Lk 24:49); "you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come down upon you; and you shall be my witnesses . . . to the end of the earth. And when he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up and a cloud took him out of their sight" (Acts 1:8-9). An exalting spectacle this was that left the apostles astonished, "gazing into heaven," until two angels came to rouse them. Gabriel of St Mary Magdalen O.C.D.



Prayer: The Ascension of Our Lord

Your resurrection, O Lord is our hope, your ascension our glorification. Grant that we may ascend with you and that our hearts may be raised to you. But grant also that in ascending we may not become proud nor presume on our merits as though they belonged to us; let our hearts be lifted up, but lifted close to you, for to lift them up to anything but you is pride; in raising them to you

is security. You who ascend to heaven are made our refuge...
Who is he that ascends? The very one who came down. You came, O Lord to heal me, you ascended to lift me up. If I raise myself up by myself, I fall; if you raise me up, I remain steady...
To you who rise again I say: Lord you are my hope; to you who ascend into heaven: you are my refuge (Ser 261:1)

Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Luke 24:46-53

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.

'And now I am sending down to you what the Father has promised. Stay in the city then, until you are clothed with the power from on high.' Then he took them out as far as the outskirts of Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven. They worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God.
