



Reflection on 27th Sunday of Ordinary Time by Father Gabriel of St Mary Magdalen, O.C.D.

Lord, increase our faith (Lk 17:5) Today's Liturgy all hinges on the theme of faith. The prophet Habbakuk (1:2-3; 2:2-4) complained to God about the desolate conditions of his people. Internally, there was wickedness, because Israel was unfaithful to its God, and externally there was injustice and violence, for the country was being subjected to devastation by enemies. They were the instruments of divine justice in the punishment of the Jews, but are no less sinners than they. This is the scandal of the triumph of evil, which seemingly destroys all good and involves even the good in ruin. God finally answered his prophet with a vision that he wished to be written out clearly for the instruction of all to come; above all, God urged constancy, because justice would be done, but in his time. "If it seems slow, wait for it; it will surely come." And in this manner: "He whose soul is not upright in him shall fail, but the righteous shall live by his faith" (ib. 3-4). This instruction is for Israelites, for Christians, for believers in every age. It is valid in every circumstance of life for individuals, for nations, for the Church. Even when everything is turned around as if God did not see or did not exist, we must remain steadfast in our faith. God may delay in intervening, but it is certain that he will intervene in favor of those who believe in him and depend upon him. "In everything God works for good with those who love him" (Rom 8:28). The second reading (2 Tim 1:6-8, 13-14) develops another aspect of faith: courageous testimony to Christ and to the gospel. St. Paul wrote to Timothy: "Do not be ashamed then of testifying to our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel in the power of God" (ib. 8). The intrepid Apostle who had faced numberless battles and dangers for his faith, and who considered it his glory to be in chains for Christ's sake, could, with good reason, exhort his disciple and collaborator not to be intimidated by difficulties, but to suffer with him for the gospel. The Christian who is not prepared to suffer something for his faith will not be able to resist the onslaughts of the enemy. It is only human to feel timid or afraid in certain circumstances, but these feelings are overcome "by the power of God" and "by the help of the Holy Spirit, who dwells within us" (ib. 8, 14). The Spirit, in fact, has been given to the faithful to sustain them in their weakness (Rom 8:26), and to enable them to confess the name of the Lord (1 Cor 12:3). After these reflections, there spontaneously arises the prayer which we read in today's Gospel: "Lord, increase my faith!" (Lk 17:5-10). In order to believe without wavering, and to remain faithful to God whether in adversity or in struggles with faith, we need a steady, solid faith, which only God can give. Jesus once said to the Apostles when they were inquiring about this: "If you had faith as a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be rooted up and be planted in the sea,' and it would obey you" (ib. 6). This was figurative language, but it expressed the omnipotence of faith. Jesus was not asking for much, only for a grain of faith as big as the very tiny mustard seed, which is not larger than a pinhead. But if this faith is genuine, living, and convinced, it will be capable of things so great that they are inconceivable from a human point of view. Jesus wanted to educate his disciples to a faith without uncertainty or hesitation, one which, relying on the power of God, believes all, hopes all, and dares all, and perseveres indomitably even in the bitterest and darkest vicissitudes.
