Reflection on the 2nd Sunday In Ordinary Time by Father Gabriel of St Mary Magdalen, O.C.D.

O God who sanctifies us in Christ Jesus, give us your grace and peace (1 Cor 1:2-3)

In the spirit of Epiphany, today's readings continue to show forth Christ's divinity and his mission. In place of the Father's testimony declaring: "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased" (Mt 3:17), we are given that of St. John the Baptist, who proclaims: "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" (Jn 1:29). Jesus, whom the father had presented as his beloved Son, is now shown to us as the innocent lamb who will be sacrificed in expiation for sin.

Thus we are not dealing with a political messiah, come to bring earthly power and glory to Israel, but with "the servant of Yahweh" announced by Isaiah, who takes upon himself the iniquity of mankind and atones for it by his death. Through his sacrifice he becomes the light and salvation, not of Israel only, but of all men; in him the glory of God is made manifest: "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified . . . I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth" (Is 49:3-6).

When Isaiah's prophecy is read by Christian eyes, it becomes very clear. He whom God designated by the mouth of his prophet as "his servant" is the very one whom now, in the fullness of time, he points out to the world as "his Son" in whom is all his pleasure. Christ's divinity shines forth: the Only-Begotten of the Father, he is God like the Father; when he took human nature his divinity was not diminished. Yet he hid it, almost as if annihilating it, when he took the form of a servant and abased himself to the state of a lamb offered in holocaust.

But precisely by means of this sacrifice, which opens into the resurrection, he recovers his full glory as Son of God, and gains the power of sharing it with all men, redeeming them from sin and presenting them to the Father as sons. Confronted with the greatness of Christ, John observes his own littleness and confesses: "This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks before me, because he was before me'" (Jn 1:30).

Enlightened from above, he recognizes the absolute primacy of Christ and of his mission; he is "God's chosen one" who has come to baptize, not with water, but "with the Holy Spirit" (ib. 33-34). In comparison, with Christ every apostle is nothing, or rather has value, and is able to act, only insofar as he depends humbly and entirely on him.



St Francis de Sales (Feast Day 24 January)

When Francis was named a Doctor of the Church, it was under the title Doctor of Divine Love. Francis' personal devotion to the Lord and life of ministry flowed from his own love for God and awareness of God's love. When Francis' devoted friend, Bishop Jean-Pierre Camus, questioned him about how to grow in love of God and neighbor, Francis replied simply, *"You learn to speak by speaking, to study by studying, to run by running, to work by working. Just so you learn to love God and many by loving. If you really want to love God, go on and love Him more and more."*

This simple approach to God is a hallmark of Francis' spirituality. Without pretending that such growth in holiness would be quick or easy, he offered straightforward guidance that people in any vocation or stage of life could follow. While we may not be able to love God perfectly and completely today, we can certainly strive for that and lay our foundation today. Francis shows us that God's love toward us and our love toward God are reciprocal, growing in relation to one another.

A quote from St. Francis de Sales is, *"Have patience with all things, but chiefly have patience with yourself."* Francis offers the guidance of a gentle, compassionate father. He knew firsthand the temptation towards despair at our lowliness before God, but he also knew personally that God offers us the grace we need in our pilgrimage towards Him. God knows each of us intimately—our strengths and our struggles—and looks into our hearts. Rather than being overwhelmed by our shortcomings, spiritual and otherwise, Francis encourages us to extend God's own gentleness and patience to ourselves.

As Francis says elsewhere, God *"delights to show forth his power in our weakness, his mercy in our misery."*


