Reflection on the 6th Sunday In Ordinary Time by Father Gabriel of St Mary Magdalen, O.C.D.

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A Blessed are they who walk in the law of the Lord (Ps 119:1)

Fidelity to the law of God is one of the central themes of the Old Testament, and it is interesting to see how the sacred author stresses man's responsibility in the face of this obligation. "If you will, you can keep the commandments; and to act faithfully is a matter of your own choice . . . Before a man are life and death, and whichever he chooses will be given to him" (Sir 15:15, 17). This is like saying that whoever follows the divine law will have life, and whoever turns his back upon it will meet death; eternal life as well as eternal death are but the consequence of his choices. Man is free, and therefore he is responsible for his actions; the evil he commits is to be blamed only on himself.

God "has not commanded any one to be ungodly, and he has not given any one permission to sin" (ib. 20). Love and faithfulness to the law constituted the entire justice and holiness of the people of Israel. However, the law was not yet perfect and men had made it too materialistic. Jesus comes and says "Think not that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets. I have come not to abolish them, but to fulfill them" (Mt 5:17). Jesus is teaching that fidelity to the material, external law is not enough; a deeper and more interior fidelity is demanded, one which engages mind and heart. "You have heard that it was said to the men of old . . . but I say to you . . ."; with this sentence, repeated six times, St. Matthew indicates the chief substance of the completion Jesus gave the law. For instance, it is not enough not to kill; we must guard against even simple words that express dislike or scorn or resentment against our neighbor.

When we harbor anger or a grudge toward our brother we are, as it were, killing rum in our heart; he is dead to our love, excluded from our good will and concern. It is not enough to abstain from actual actions against the law, we must also eliminate evil thoughts and desires, because he who consents to these has already sinned "in his heart" (ib. 28): he has killed his brother or has committed adultery, whatever the case may be. The work of excelling and completing the old law consists precisely in a careful attention to interior purity and to justice, not only in external behavior which is visible to all, but in the deep stirrings of heart and mind as well, which can be seen only by God.

The prophets in the Old Testament had already spoken many times in this vein, but only Jesus, eternal Wisdom, could give the law its final perfection. For the Christian to be able to understand and live on such a level, he must let himself be penetrated with the wisdom of the gospel, which is not the wisdom of this world, but "a secret and hidden wisdom" (1 Cor 2:7): the mystery of Christ's cross which each of us must relive by dying to the wisdom of the world and of the flesh.





If you wish, you can keep the commandments, to behave faithfully is within your power. He has set fire and water before you; put out your hand to whichever you prefer. Man has life and death before him; whichever a man likes better will be given him. For vast is the wisdom of the Lord; he is almighty and all-seeing. Second Reading**1 Corinthians 2:6-10****A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians**

We have a wisdom to offer those who have reached maturity: not a philosophy of our age, it is true, still less of the masters of our age, which are coming to their end. The hidden wisdom of God which we teach in our mysteries is the wisdom that God predestined to be for our glory before the ages began. It is a wisdom that none of the masters of this age have ever known, or they would not have crucified the Lord of

Glory; we teach what scripture calls: the things that no eye has seen and no ear has heard, things beyond the mind of man, all that God has prepared for those who love him. These are the very things that God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit reaches the depths of everything, even the depths of God.

Gospel**Matthew 5:20-22. 27-28. 33-34. 37****A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew**

Jesus said to his disciples: I tell you, if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven.

'You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not kill; and if anyone does kill he must answer for it before the court. But I say this to you: anyone who is angry with his brother will answer for it before the court.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must not commit adultery. But I say this to you: if a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

'Again, you have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not break your oath, but must fulfil your oaths to the Lord. But I say this to you: do not swear at all. All you need say is "Yes" if you mean yes, "No" if you mean no; anything more than this comes from the evil one.'
