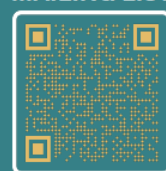
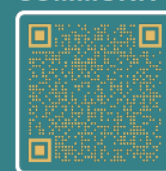

HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION



This year the Feast of the Assumption falls on a Saturday. The Archbishop has sent us some guidelines on managing Masses that day.



He reminds us that it is not possible to fulfil the obligation for the two days (The Assumption and the usual Sunday) by attending a vigil Mass on Saturday. Two separate Masses must be attended.



He also mentions that a vigil Mass on Friday evening will fulfil the obligation. Consequently we will have a special Vigil Mass on Friday, 14th August.

JOHN WILSON

METROPOLITAN ARCHBISHOP OF SOUTHWARK

Archbishop John Wilson was born in Sheffield on 4 July 1968 and educated in theology at the University of Leeds before entering priestly formation at the Venerable English College in Rome in 1989. During his seminary formation, he completed a Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University, and a Licence in Moral Theology at the Accademia Alfonsiana. He was ordained priest for the Diocese of Leeds on 29 July 1995.

In 2015 Pope Francis named him Auxiliary Bishop of Westminster, ordained bishop in 2016, before becoming Archbishop of Southwark in 2019.

Celebrating First Holy Communion



First Holy Communion will be celebrated on Sunday, 20th September at the 10am Mass at St Patrick's Church Bondi Beach. This is one of the greatest moments in a child's life, an unforgettable experience of closeness of God.

PREPARATION PROGRAMME

A four-week consecutive programme of instruction is necessary. Parent/guardian must attend together with their child for all four sessions.

The four sessions will be held at 6:30pm in St Anne's Parish Hall (Oakley Road entrance) on:

- Tuesday 25th August,
- Tuesday 1st September,
- Tuesday 8th September, and
- Tuesday 15th Sept^r

REQUIREMENTS

To receive First Holy Communion, a child must be baptised, have received the Sacrament of Penance in the Catholic Church, and be in Year 3 or above.

Matthew 14:22-33

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a headwind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'
